## Benedictine Sisters’ Clyde oblates enjoy retreat, celebrate oblation

CLYDE, Mo. - The Clyde community of the Benedictine Sisters of Perpetual Adoration celebrated its annual retreat for oblates Sept. 26-28, concluding with an oblation ceremony for two women in the Adoration Chapel.

Fifteen oblates attended the weekend conference, enjoying a presentation on the Prologue to the Rule of Benedict by Father Daniel Petsche, OSB of Conception Abbey.

Geri Herfkens and Betty Carneal made their oblations, and Marie Fitch has begun a one-year formation program as an oblate candidate.

Oblates are not vowed members but Christian adults formally affiliated with a Benedictine monastic family to seek God more intentionally. They are of any faith, man or woman, married or single, who find support and growth in holiness through spiritual association with a vowed monastic community by incorporating the Rule of Benedict and adapting monastic practices to their own lives.

During the oblation process, interested people spend six months learning
